Annual Report

The Chairman gave a resume of activities with highlights as follows:

- 400 rides were held during the year with 145 active riders which amounted to over 3000 individual rides. There are 6 Wednesday ride groups and 7 weekend groups. There are 55 ride leaders covering these groups. There are 188 members on Spond with a further 25 non members a working group has been formed to improve useage and access.
- The Tour of the Hills entries were down but a healthy surplus of around £600 was made.
- The annual dinner was held in early Spring with 50 attendees.
- A ride leaders' workshop was held.
- Since the last AGM 55 new riders have shown an interest and 28 joined.
- The library of club rides is being posted on the club's account on Ride With GPS

Treasurer's Report

Keith Stainer reported that the club is in a healthy financial position with funds of £4613. There was a surplus of £212 for the year. The stock level (comprising club kit) stands at £174. Nick Moses has audited the accounts. The club has received an annual contribution of £200 from CUK.
